- Measure 2.3 Improvement of energy efficiency and promotion of renewable energy sources
- Effective and sustainable use of energy resources, energy savings
- Development of alternative and renewable energy sources



Requirements to the projects

- Advance payments will be made to the projects after signing the Grant Contract and during the project implementation
- Implementation of the project can start only after signing the Grant Contract
- No project preparation costs can be covered



Requirements to the projects

- At least two partners have to participate, at least one from EU (Estonia or Latvia) and at least one from Russia
- Project management has to be based on the Lead-partner principle
- Requested grant for the project has to be between 300,000
 2,000,000 EUR

Duration of the project cannot exceed 36 months.



Project has to

- have cross-border character
- contribute to achievement of the Programme objective
- fit under the Programme Priorities
- address needs of the target group
- have clear objectives and quantifiable outputs
- ensure sustainability of the achieved results
- be in line with the national and regional policies
- be based on the real need for cooperation programme

Project examples

- INTERREG IIIA Priority North (Estonia Latvia Russia)
 - Influence of dam and turbines of Narva hydropower station on the migration of European eel from Lake Peipsi basin
 - Development of cross-border energy efficient municipal services



Where to start from?

- Define the problem you want to solve by the means of the Programme
- Think about the possible partners according to the requirements of the Programme
- Define the target group, involve it and base your project on their needs
- Have regular meetings with the partners, keep them informed and divide the responsibilities clearly atvia
- Define the objectives, possible activities and time plan****
